By a gentleman from Jefferson we are informed that on the plantation of Mr. Ephraim Pieves (?) near Brier Creek, about 18 miles, from this place, a body of earth about 90 feet in circumference, sunk, as supposed on Friday night - that the earth being held on one side by the roots of a tree at the edge of the opening, sunk in a (?) direction and that the lower part of it was covered with water, in which the bottom was not found with a sixteen foot pole. The gentleman saw that opening but does not know that any other attempt to find the bottom was made, there being no pole at hand, when he was there, longer than the sixteen foot one.
