Yesterday morning (23rd inst.) a few minutes before 9 o'clock the inhabitants of this place were again alarmed by an Earthquake, equal in duration to, and, it is thought, more severe than the first on the morning of the 16th ult. Several chimnies were broken off, clocks stopped, and glasses thrown off tables, and is said by some, that fissures in the ground several yards long, and an inch and a half wide, were discovered in the street near the Market House. (For the truth of the latter we will not vouch). Certain it is said that the citizens were very much alarmed, and particularly the Ladies.
