Dec. 16, 1811

23rd shock twenty-four minutes after 2 o'clock in the morning, continued to be very sensibly felt two minutes, the wind still, high -
24th shock at 11 o'clock at night, sensibly felt.

*New Bourbon, two miles south of Ste. Genevieve, was settled by French Royalists after the Revolution. The settlement never thrived, however, and it has long since disappeared. The leaders were Camille Delassus and M. Demunn of the ancienne noblessee.
