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At Nottingham, in Maryland, the shock was alleged to have happened twenty minutes after nine, and to have lasted a minute. The writer of the account was sitting in a room with two other persons, occupied in reading, when it was asked by one of them what made the chamber shake so? This called attention of them all to the movement, which they described as having the same effects as the rolling of a vessel on an agitated sea.
