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Yesterday, between the hours of eight and nine in the morning, an earthquake was very severely felt in this place. - The shock appeared to come from the west or southwest, and was nothing more than a rocking of the earth to and fro, without any sudden concussion or jar, and is supposed to have continued about one minute.

From the different accounts, received verbally and collected from news-papers, of those which happened two or three weeks ago, it would appear that the shocks had been much more severely felt near the banks of the rivers, than other places. A reason for this, however, we are not able to give, and that it was absolutely the case, we will not pretend to assert, but it appears that they were scarcely noticed at Chilicothe, except along or near the banks of the largest streams.
